Introduction

West Lothian College Student Association was officially established in 2014 where two years of funding were granted by the Scottish Government in order to develop 'autonomous and sustainable' Student Associations throughout the Scottish Further Education sector.

In the initial year 2014-15, The Student Association team comprising of our, first full time sabbatical President, part time Vice President and Development Officer, created our own recognisable brand which included a logo and strap line. We also located a space which would be utilised as a Student Association office. This provided a sense of identity, belonging and ownership and a friendly informal place where students could drop in for a confidential chat and support from other students. A number of competitions and focus groups were run to ensure Students were at the forefront of the design process.

2015-16 saw the development of our foundations. Our constitution and code of conduct were created in order to provide a framework for the Student Association and a way for our team to be held accountable for their actions. In addition, a number of training materials were developed alongside a strategic plan and operational plan to ensure formal direction.

Furthermore, an evaluation was carried out of the Student Association structure and its overall effectiveness. It was concluded that the structure could be more effective with better College/Student Association partnership working with the introduction of seven part time vice presidents, one from each academic centre. This new structure was approved and trailed in 2016-17. A new Student Association structure was formed comprising of one full time sabbatical student President, seven part time Vice Presidents all supported by the Development Officer. Our Student Association has evolved and grown to meet the ever changing needs of our students. We continue to listen to their needs, work in partnership with the College and support students throughout their college experience.

The main aims of the student association are underpinned within this strategic plan. We will always put our students at the forefront of any decision and act in their best interests to ensure that all West Lothian Students have a fantastic College experience.
